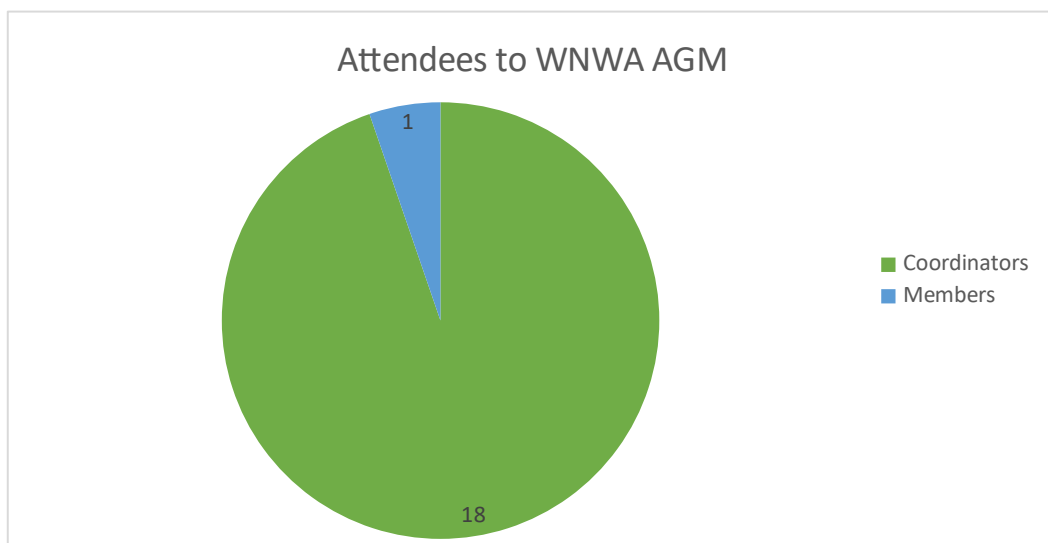


Wandsworth Neighbourhood Watch Association (WNWA) AGM Group Discussion Results – Appendix A to the 2023 AGM minutes

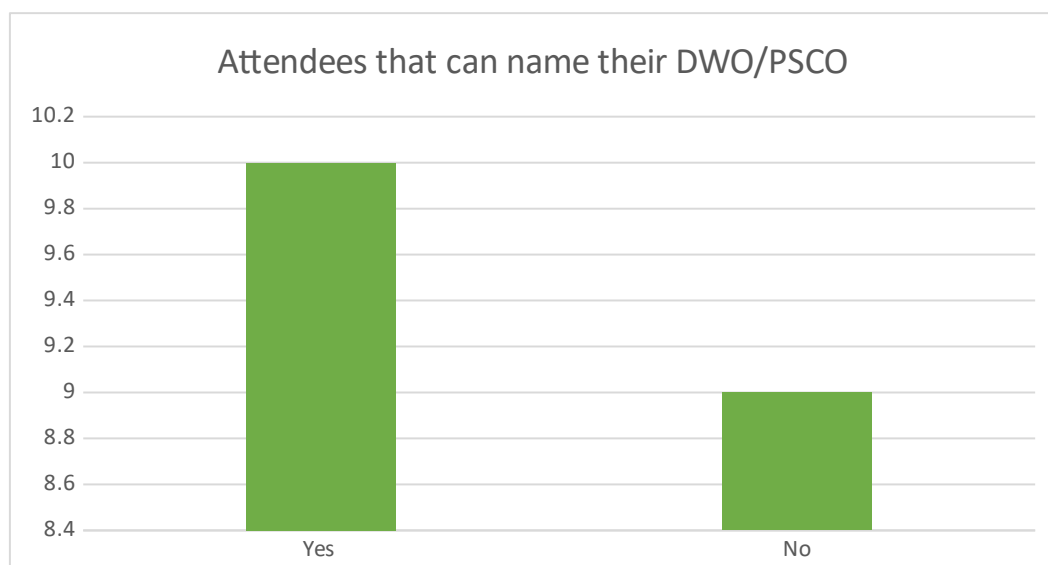

Huddle Questions Round 1: Liaison Baseline

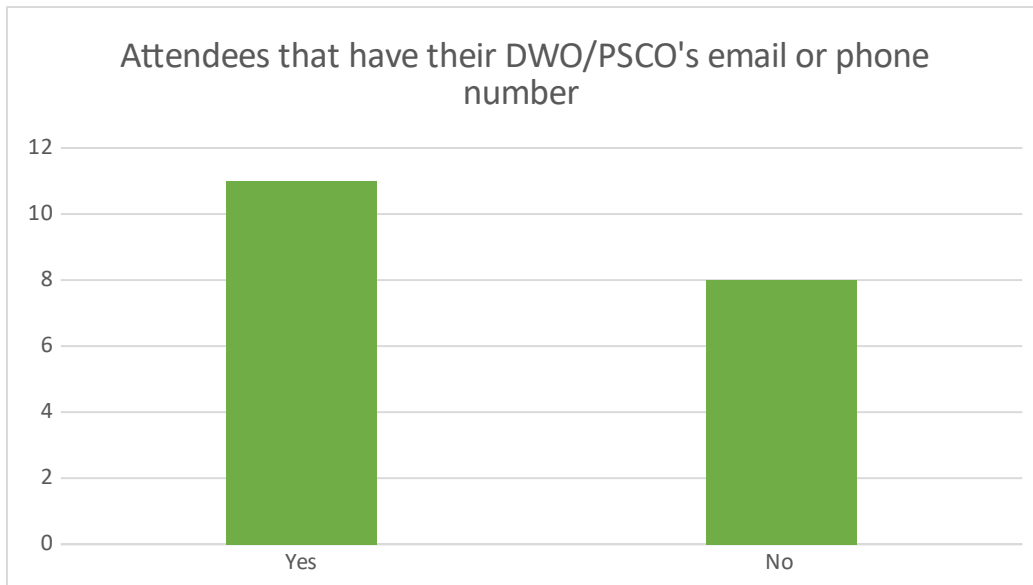
Numbers of coordinators/members in attendance:



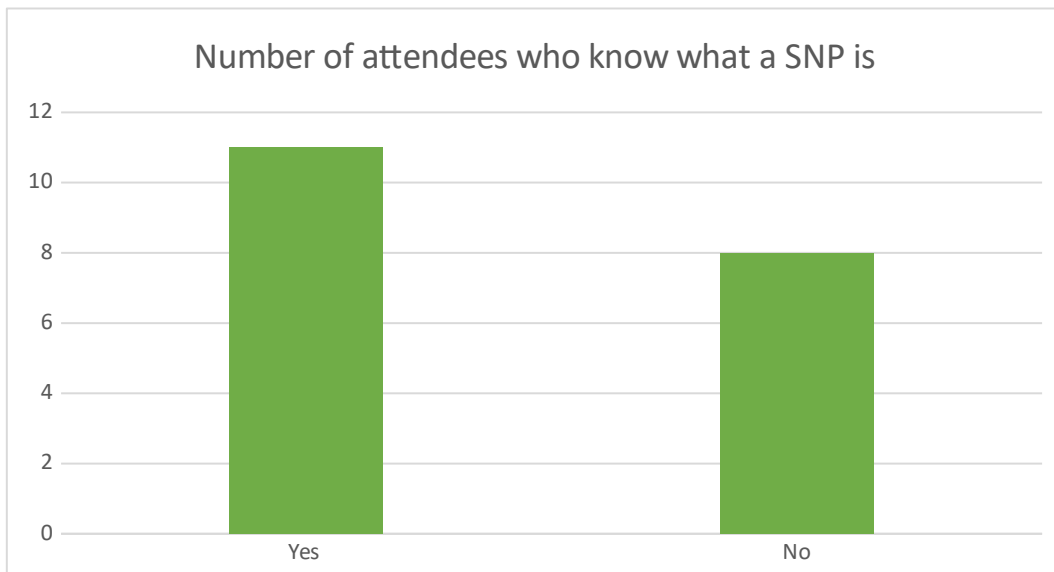
Number of attendees that can name their DWO/PSCO:



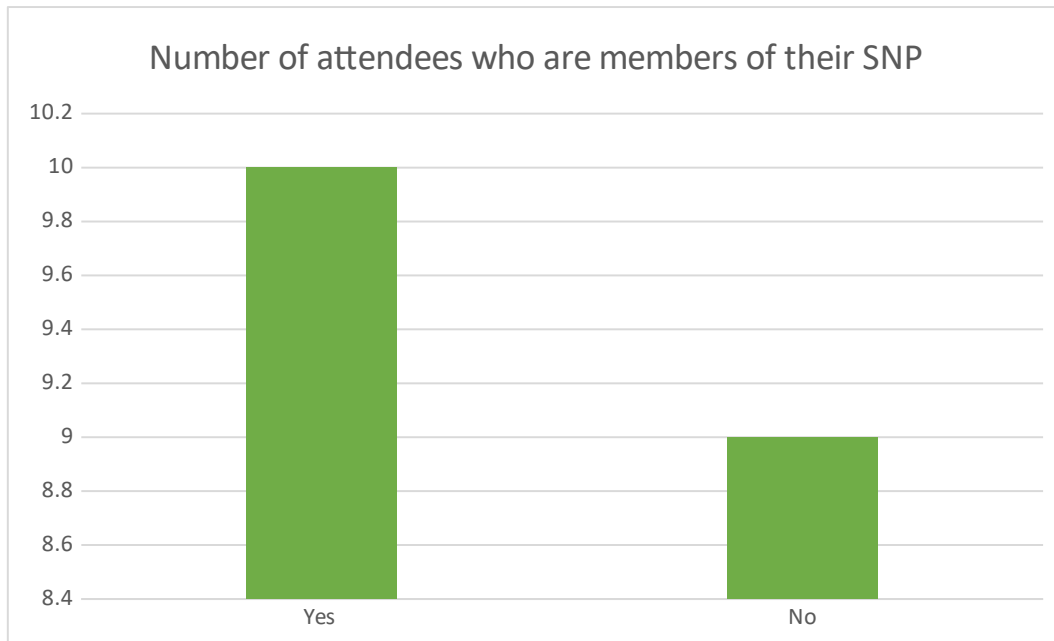
Attendees that have their DWO/PSCO's email or phone number:



Attendees who know what a Safer Neighbourhood Ward Panel (SNP) is:

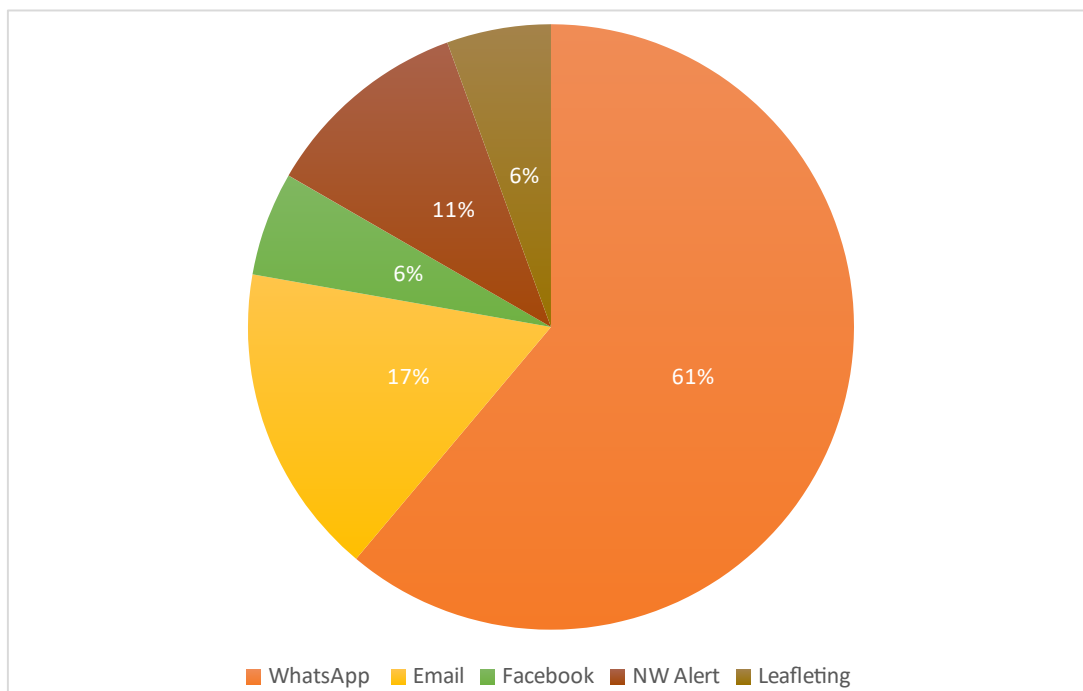


Attendees who are members of their Safer Neighbourhood Ward Panel (SNP)

Huddle Questions Round 3: Publicity

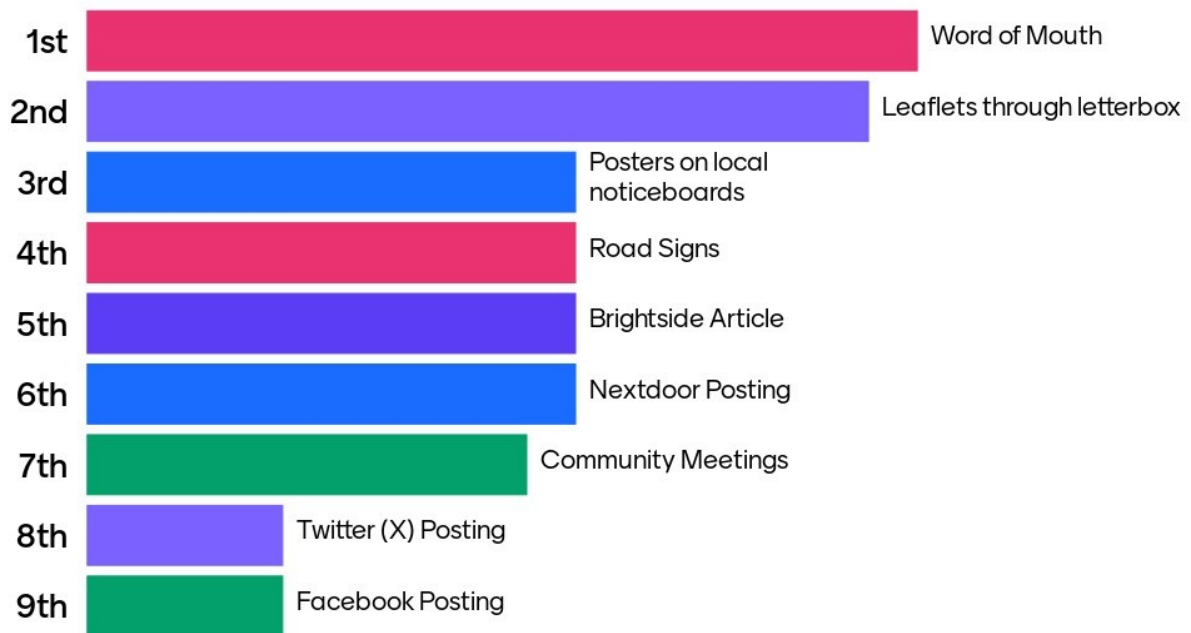
Attendees with NW street signs in their road:
