Romance fraud and scam awareness

Romance fraud is when scammers use an apparent (but fake) romantic connection or relationship to lure their victims into a false sense of security, before tricking them into giving them money, or information which helps them steal money from them.

If the scammer successfully persuades their victim to lend or give them money, they will usually come back with further reasons for needing more. Sometimes, the victim is asked to pass money from another country through their account – this could be money laundering.

Spotting the signs

People who have fallen victim to romance scams tend to report the same pattern. If you or someone you know is using online dating or friendship sites and sees any of these signs, it may indicate you or they are being scammed:

- The scammer asks you a lot of questions about yourself without saying much about themselves in return
- The discussion is friendly at first but turns romantic very quickly
- Their story, or parts of it, change over time and become inconsistent
- They refuse to video call you, or meet in person
- Eventually, the scammer asks you to lend them money

What can you do to protect against romance fraud?

Despite the prevalence of online romance scams and fraud, it doesn't mean that you have to stop using dating sites altogether. You just have to be aware that scammers do exist, and follow some simple rules to protect yourself online:

- If you're using social media sites like Facebook, don't accept friend requests from people you don't know
- Don't give away too many personal details about yourself online
- Never send or receive money or give away your bank details to someone you've only met online
- Use reputable dating sites







Start the year by protecting your privacy - a 'stalkerware' quick check with Avast

Imagine starting the New Year with hopes of a fresh start, only to realise that someone might be tracking your every move without your consent. Disconcerting, to say the least.

Criminals can do this using stalkerware, a sinister form of spyware that secretly monitors a person's activities and takes away their privacy. But that's not all. With location-sharing apps being the norm, the tracking risks increase. Unlike traditional spyware, stalkerware is often installed with malicious intent by someone known to the victim, such as a partner or family member, to track their whereabouts, communications, and more.

1. Check your app permissions

Stalkerware requires various permissions to function, such as access to SMS, call logs, contacts, and location. Regularly check the permissions granted to your apps and remove anything unusual or from apps you don't recognise.

2. Audit your location sharing

Location sharing is a convenient feature but can also be risky. Review who you're sharing your location with, especially if it's been a while. If it doesn't make sense for an app to have location access, revoke it.

3. Review your app list

Go through your installed apps and look for anything suspicious.

4. Watch for performance red flags

If your phone's battery drains unusually fast, you notice sudden error messages, or experience strange requests for permissions, it could indicate stalkerware.

5. Install security software

Use security solutions - <u>think Avast One</u> - to scan your phone for known malicious apps, including stalkerware and spyware. Regular scans can help you identify and remove potential threats.
